

CHARTER FOR THE PROTECTION OF MONTREAL'S GREEN SPACES AND NATURAL ENVIRONMENTS

WHEREAS worldwide studies and experience indicate that our living environment is being degraded;

WHEREAS green spaces and natural environments on the Island of Montréal are part of our common heritage;

WHEREAS urban sprawl has harmful ecological impacts;

WHEREAS urban sprawl also has harmful social and collective impacts, including segregation, marginalization, prohibitive infrastructure costs and a decline in natural spaces;

WHEREAS natural environments and green spaces have a direct impact on the quality of life and health of the city and its population;

WHEREAS Montréal has unconditionally committed itself to the right to a healthy environment and to combatting climate change, and was the host city to the Secretariat of the United Nations Convention on Biological Diversity;

WHEREAS we, members of the scientific community and the civilian population, unanimously demand a decisive change in traditional development policies to immediately prioritize our shared environmental heritage;

It is resolved that the Montreal Agglomeration:



Put an immediate stop to all urban sprawl on the Island of Montréal by declaring a permanent moratorium on all infrastructure and development projects targeting green spaces and natural environments on its territory;



Protect the biodiversity, the uniqueness of ecosystems and the integrity of habitats on 100% of its territory;



Plan development of its territory in a manner that reduces individual automobile use and expands the public transit network in order to end social exclusion;



Provide access to green spaces on its territory to the entire population, particularly children and disadvantaged and marginalized groups including people with reduced mobility.
